CAMPBELLTOWN

Mt Annan Botanical Gardens: Narellan Road, Mt Annan
Open every day from 8am to 5pm and 8am to 7pm in summer Take a
walk across 416 hectares of varying Australian bushland, grassland
and gardens. See specialist plant sections. There are 20k of paths and
roadways for cycling (bring your own bike). Lots of opportunities for
photography and bird observation, and also a great playground for
little children. Picnic in the grounds or have a meal at the restaurant.
Guided tours run from the Visitor Centre.

WINGECARRIBEE SHIRE Mittagong/Bowral/Moss Vale

Hoskins Reserve: Bus runs past the area every hour. By car, park near the bridge over the Wingecarribee River at Bong Bong, between Moss Vale and Bowral; you can also park at Hoskins Reserve which is a NP&WS area to the east (sorry, no dogs) or walk along the river from the road bridge. Picnic area, easy walks and great interpretive signs to help you get the best from the outing. If you are lucky, you may see a platypus or a rakali in the river and many water birds can be observed. People can also fish for carp.

GOULBURN

Historic Waterworks

Entry is available every Sunday from 10am – 4pm, Monday and Tuesday from 10am – 2pm, school and public holidays 10am–4pm. The Waterworks are on the banks of the picturesque Wollondilly River at Marsden Weir, Goulburn. Built between 1883 and 1885, this rare facility is the only complete, steam powered municipal water supply left in its original location, in the Southern Hemisphere. The Waterworks is listed on the State Heritage and National Trust Registers. Enjoy a picnic beside the picturesque Wollondilly River or wander through the Pumphouse Museum to enjoy a static display of the massive steam operated engines. The kids will be entertained with the children's playground and colouring in and puzzle sheets. There's a free electric BBQ too!

YASS

This special locality in Yass allows visitors to enjoy a walk along the River on an adventurous path. The area can be entered from the cul-de-sac at the end of Meehan St, or from the Rossi St trail at the bottom of Demestre St, or near Flat Rock Crossing on Warrumbalulah St. There are a number of other tracks and walkways along the river and in the vicinity. There are excellent connections between the swimming centre, the shopping centre and down towards Riverside Park. You can have a number of explorations into quite wild seeming country, yet you are not far from town.

GRIFFITH

Jacks Creek walking track Cocoparra National Park
Bushwalking with a twist with the intriguing, varied habitats of
Cocoparra National Park. Setting out from Jacks Creek picnic area,
you'll explore a vast gorge, walking through sheltered gullies and
along exposed ridges. Three lookouts give scenic views of the gorge
and surrounding landscape. After rain, the gorge is alive with running
water, accompanied by frog song. Look out for a variety of woodland
birds overhead, peregrine falcons roosting in the cliffs and flying
through the gorge, and white-winged choughs nesting above the
tables in the picnic area. Look carefully at those shadows in the rock
caves – they may be hiding swamp wallabies keen to avoid the heat of
the day.

WAGGA WAGGA

Wiradjuri Walking Track

The Wiradjuri Walking Track covers around 42 kilometres, circling much of the City and exploring riverbanks, hilltops and everything inbetween. It also winds through Silvalite Reserve and Pomingarlarna Park – perfect for a little wildlife spotting or enjoying some of the best views over the city! The Wollundry Loop is 12.1 kilometres and a more leisurely walk, following part of the Murrumbidgee River and the perimeter of the Wollundry Lagoon.

CANBERRA

Black Mountain off Black Mt Summit Road and Rani Road ACT Discover fantastic views appearing through the trees as you walk around the marked walking trails. Black Mountain is the most diverse of Canberra's nature parks. It houses 100 species of birds, 500 species of plants and 5000 species of insects. The wildflowers in spring and early summer are beautiful. You may even surprise reptiles sunning themselves on the path.

YOUNG

The Lambing Flat Chinese Tribute Gardens are located at the Chinaman's Dam reserve just four kilometres from the town centre. Now a well established garden set in a quiet, relaxing and picturesque site, the gardens are the perfect spot for a relaxing morning or afternoon with picnic facilities and barbecues. After crossing the bridge to the garden and passing the marble lion sculptures guarding the garden entrance, make your way to the garden viewing platform and sit and relax overlooking the garden and the Pool of Tranquillity.

QUEANBEYAN

Googong Foreshores

Located 10 kilometres south of Queanbeyan, Googong Foreshores is a great place to observe wildlife and go canoeing, fishing and mountain biking. It also has a fascinating historic homestead and London Bridge Arch. The entire Foreshores area is a Wildlife Refuge. Whether you like picnicking, birdwatching, bushwalking, mountain bike riding, enjoy sailing and fishing or delving into history — at Googong there's something for everyone.


Bank Processing and Clearing Time
