Fire Safety (Cooking Safety)

Almost half of all home fires start in the kitchen.

- Do not put anything metallic in the microwave and always double check the timer.
- Avoid cooking under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
- Never leave cooking unattended. Stay in the kitchen while cooking and turn off the stove before you leave.
- Flammable materials such as aerosols, cleaning agents and cooking oils should be store away from heat.
- Keep matches out of reach of children.
- Turn pot handles inwards.
- Keep loose clothing, fabrics, tea towels, curtains and flammable items away from the stove.

Reminder:

Smoke Alarms are required by law to be tested every year. We have arranged for the Smoke Alarms Australia to conduct these tests. Letters have been sent, so please provide access. If you are required to change the appointment. Please contact Smoke Alarms Australia on 1300 125 276
