Fire Safety (Cooking Safely)

Almost half of all home fires start in the kitchen

- Do not put anything metallic in the microwave and always double-check the timer
- Avoid cooking under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs
- Never leave cooking unattended.
- Flammable materials such as aerosols, cleaning agents and cooking oils should be stored away from the heat
- Keep matches out of reach of children
- Keep loose clothing, fabrics, tea towels, curtains and flammable items away from the stove
